- ♥ The same activities should not be used to fulfill more than one requirement.
- ♥ Awesome Assembly forms must be submitted by **February 15, 2011.** They need to be signed by the Worthy Advisor and Mother Advisor. Please send them to the address below.
- ♥ Don't forget that the definition of pure service hours is a donation of time, skills, or services that have been given from the heart with no monetary payment in return.
- ♥ Awesome Assemblies will be announced at Grand Assembly. Each assembly (not previously designated an A.A.) will be given a special patch and 2011 charms for each member to wear proudly! Awesome Assemblies earning this award for subsequent years will receive special patches for each new member and 2011 charms for all members.
